Historic Cold Spring Village is an early American open-air living history museum located three miles north of Cape May City, NJ. Here you will experience the sights, sounds and scents of yesteryear: the blacksmith working over a fiery forge; the potter turning pots on the footpowered kickwheel; the horse-drawn wagon rumbling over the clamshell roads; and the baker removing freshly baked bread from the beehive oven.

Although little remains of the original hamlet of Cold Spring , Historic Cold Spring Village recreates a similar town consisting of 26 antique buildings from Cape May and Cumberland counties that have been moved and restored on a 30-acre site. They house working craftspeople, a one-room school, a 19th c. tavern, Welcome Center, a country store, a bakery , ice cream parlor and the Old Grange restaurant.

In 2012 the daily admission for adults is \$10, children 3-12 \$8, children under 3 free.

Hours 10AM to 4:30PM, closed Mondays.

Open weekends only May 26 to June 17, open Tuesday through Sunday June 19 through September 2.

Also open 2nd and 3rd weekends in September
